#### Minister's Message





#### Spiritual Assistant's Letter

Editor's note: In memory of our 25th anniversary on becoming the La Verna Region in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, it might seem fitting to read from two of our former regional spiritual assistants, Fr. Ulric Buening and Br. James Buda. Both RSAs wrote their thoughts on how we may better vision ourselves as Secular Franciscans. Their original RSA article was published in the *La Verna Vision* newsletter, Spring 1997 edition.

"Jesus, teaches us through his death just what it means to give up everything.

As Secular Franciscans. We can imitate our blessed
Savior in his poverty, by our challenge to relinquish all for the sake of the kingdom. This sets us apart as Secular Franciscans for it shows that we are a people who care and are concerned with the poor of this world.

"Our call to Franciscan life once again reminds us of Francis' response to his life of faith, from a position of privilege into the world of the poor. His renunciation of the world, though radical, was apparently not odious to him. We sense that for Francis the gospel promise was fulfilled, that what one receives in return is far more than what one has given up. Francis renounced the world only to have it given back with joy. It was not long after his break with family and social life in Assisi that Francis was joined by others who formed with him a community among the poor. The story of Francis teaches us that the invitation and challenge to

relinquishment is extended not just to us as Secular Franciscans, but to our fraternities. We recall that the invitation to the rich young man in the gospel was to join the discipleship community as they traveled along the way.

"The work of relinquishment is difficult for us as individuals to realize, but in fraternity, we cultivate a common vision that facilitates relinquishment. Fraternity gives us the support necessary to take those steps out of our comfort zones toward the margins of society. Like that rich man in the gospel we are generous, we support the "right" causes, and we can list the laws that we have obeyed as...
"good, moral people."

"If we adopt this posture, we will never really understand the gospel invitation before us. We can invoke rational arguments for moderation and good sense against the way of Jesus and the way of Francis. This is understandable, for there is something foolish and risky... even senseless, about this path. How can a way that seems so negative promise the kind of delight...joy... and abundant life . . . that Jesus promised . . . and Francis found? As poor persons, we stand in utter and absolute need, unable to go it alone.

"As poor persons, we stand dependent before our God, who knows our needs and hears our cry. As poor persons we come to know the God who loves us as we are. As poor persons, we identify with all other poor persons. We pray that God

will meet the needs of poor persons as we work to lighten their burdens and to share the earth's goods with them.

"Help us, most loving God, to treasure the poor people in our midst, to share our goods, and to receive the gifts that poor people offer to us. Help us to not be angry or resentful toward them. Help us to know that we are, indeed, one of them before you."

Fr. Ulric Buening, OFM Cap (1927 - 2006) made his solemn profession in 1949 and later served the OFS as their St. Joseph Provincial Spiritual Assistant. He served on the General Council of the TOF, participated in writing the new OFS Rule which was approved in 1978, and was the local spiritual assistant with Sts. Francis and Clare fraternity in Madison. Fr. Lester Bach, OFM Cap wrote in Uliric's obituary that Fr. Buening was "the only friar I knew who could quote the [OFS] Constitution by article and

number and then proceed to tell me what it said. He didn't need a book. His memory had absorbed the writings that were important. In his day, pastoral visitations were conducted every year. Ulric had one talk that he gave to each fraternity for the whole year."

Br. James Budda, OFM (1937 - 2015) was a member of the Franciscan Friars of the Assumption B.V.M. Province. Following his profession, he worked in the laundry and as a tailor. Later moves took him to St. Leonard Friary in Saginaw, MI, St. Mary of the Angels Friary in Green Bay, and Assumption Friary in Pulaski. During this time he assumed the role of provincial tailor. Over the years many friars wore, and continue to wear, his signature habit. Br. James also served as sacristan and organist for the community. While in Green Bay he served for 13 years as spiritual assistant to the local fraternity of the Secular Franciscans, and as a member of the regional council, regional spiritual assistant, and provincial spiritual assistant. From 1997-2005, Br. Jim served as the Guardian of St. Mary of the Angels Friary in Green Bay.

#### La Verna Regional Treasurer's Report by Bob Henning, OFS

I hope and pray that everyone has a holy and blessed Christmas.

Our La Verna Region's financial health is very good at this point and looking to continue so. This is due to every fraternity sending in their entire fair share.

Thank you for your generosity and faithfulness.

As you may remember, the fair share was increased in 2018 to \$80/year for professed members and \$40/year for Candidates. The increase was needed due to National's fair share increase to us, and increased costs to the Region coupled with inflation.

Because of the attention problems, your Regional Executive Council (REC), decided to do a couple of things. First, temporarily reduce the fair share back to the previous amount of \$50/year for professed and \$25/year for Candidate. Secondly, we gave each fraternity three options:

- 1. Pay the entire fair share,
- 2. Pay part of the fair share, or
- 3. Pay nothing if the fraternity could not collect the fair share.

There was also a new fund established through the generosity of the St. Joseph Fraternity - Appleton, WI. A donation of \$500 in 2016 that went into effect on 22 JUne, 2019. Another anonymous donation of \$100 has raised the fund total to \$600. The purpose of this fund was to help fraternities cover their fair share in the event they were unable to do so. This is a procedure the minister must initiate to begin the process. Let me know if any minister wishes a copy.

The REC has also increased the amount of the individual retreat subsidy to now be  $\frac{1}{2}$  the cost up to \$150.

With my new I-Pass

transponder securely attached to the windshield, we buzzed through tolls in Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. Even with my trusty GPS system and Teri's reliable phone, we made a few wrong turns, but with a few Hail Mary's we got back on track without too much trouble. There was an endless amount of construction along the way. When I closed my eyes, I could see hundreds of the familiar orange

construction cones, which slowed us down somewhat.

People were quite helpful when we explained where we were from and where we wanted to go. I think it helped that we wore our TAU Crosses throughout the trip.

When we arrived in Olean. New York, a little town with two significant landmarks-St. **Bonaventure University** situated alongside the Allegany River, and the beautiful Basilica St. Mary of the Angels, we were greeted by the University Archivist Dennis Frank who I met 2 years ago when I first visited our archives. Dennis explained that, due to some construction that had been going on, we could not work in our archive room, but in a nearby area with plenty of light, electric outlets, and LOTS of grit. A little cleanup was needed before plugging in my computer and printer/scanner which accompanied us on the trip.

There wasn't much time for sight-seeing as we had work to do, working 8-10 hours

each day we were there. A highlight was that we attended Mass at the Basilica on the feast of St. Clare. The priest, Fr. John Adams, gave us a little tour. He was happy to meet a couple of Secular Franciscans from Wisconsin.

Later in the week we found the local Walmart and bought a few "New York" t-shirts as souvenirs.

Teri Doughty and I dug into 4 ream-sized boxes, each containing about 50-55 file folders of National OFS documents. We sorted for



duplicates, pulled out hundreds of staples and paper clips, scanned

people share in Christ's priesthood: ever more united with Him, they exhibit the grace of Baptism and Confirmation in all dimensions of their personal family, social and ecclesial lives, and fulfill the call to holiness addressed to all the baptized".

This holiness, to which you are called as Secular Franciscans, as the General Constitutions and the Rule approved by Saint Paul VI ask of you, involves the conversion of the heart, attracted, conquered and transformed by the One who is the only Holy One, who is "the

good, every good, the supreme good" (Saint Francis, Praises of God Most High).

Pope Francis said, like St. Francis of Assisi, Christians are called to live among ordinary people as "mirrors of Christ." Pope Francis went on to say, "I urge you to embrace the Gospel as you embrace Jesus. Let the Gospel, that is, Jesus himself, shape your life. In this way, you will take on poverty, minority and simplicity as your distinguishing marks before all," he said.

The pope said that God takes the initiative in the process of conversion and penance while those who repent respond by placing themselves "at the service of others and by using mercy with them."

"Let us not confuse 'doing penance' with 'works of penance," he added. "These -- fasting, almsgiving, mortification -- are consequences of the decision to open one's heart to God."

Pope Francis asked Secular Franciscan to spend time with people, especially those in "the existential peripheries of today and make the word of the Gospel resound."

And, he said, do not forget the poor who "are the flesh of Christ."

"And just as the 'fraternities of penitents' of yesteryear distinguished themselves by founding hospitals, dispensaries, soup kitchens and other works of genuine social charity, so today the Spirit sends you to exercise the same charity with the creativity required by the new forms of poverty," the pope said.
