A Message from Our Minister~

My brothers and sisters in St. Francis.

Welcome to the latest edition of the La Verna E-Vision. We hope to provide updates on our shared journey of embracing the Franciscan charism in our everyday lives and the exciting happenings in the La Verna Region.

We just completed our 2024 District Retreat & Gathering on April 13 (Wausau) and May 4 (Milwaukee). St. James Fraternity in Wausau and Saint Francis of Assisi Fraternity in Milwaukee were warm and hospitable hosts whose attention to detail made the day flow beautifully. This year's theme was Transforming Ourselves to Love: Article 19 of OFS Rule. The format was a bit different, with the morning session focusing on a retreat led by Br. Jerome Schroeder, OFM Cap. With a focus on Article 19, Br. Jerome helped us to trust in the presence of the divine seed in everyone by first listening in silence to the Holy Spirit and then listening with our whole heart and mind to our sisters and brothers. The retreat ended with a Renewal of Commitment to our Profession. One attendee said, "Morning retreat was hugely successful. Gave us time to share and learn from one another. Beautiful way of bringing us together and giving us windows to the beautiful charisms of each other."

The afternoon session was typical of previous District Gatherings: a Q&A with members of the Regional Executive Committee, a large group share-out from the morning session and a presentation from the hosting fraternity. At the Wausau gathering we learned about the Hagar House, a faith-based nonprofit committed to providing support to single mothers in the greater Wausau area. In Milwaukee, our Regional Formation Director, Sue Bashynski, OFS kindled the flames of fraternity, faith, and service with her Connection to God talk. Another attendee said, "I liked it all. It was a good time for self-introspection. Looking back at my profession gave me a renewed spirit to keep carrying on. Thank you for the day. The food was excellent!"

Our 2024 Chapter of Elections will take place June 28-30 at St Anthony Spirituality Center. The National Presider of the elections will be John Abendroth, OFS, the Vice Minister of the Queen of Peace Region. The Queen of Peace Region covers local fraternities in the areas of Minnesota, Western Wisconsin, Iowa, Nebraska, and North and South Dakota. The National Ecclesiastical Witness will be Fr. Marek Stybor, OFM Conv. Fr. Marek is originally from Poland and is currently a member of the Conference of National Spiritual Assistants. He previously has been a missionary to Kenya and Tanzania and also served as Vocation Director, Retreat Director, Postulant Director, and Parish Priest.

Art Montgomery, St. Francis of Assisi Fraternity, Milwaukee




